This is where RVU comes in handy. Basically, Relative Value Units (RVUs) is a standard set by Medicare to determine the amount to pay doctors depending on their productivity. It is a number that defines the volume of work doctors perform when treating patients for all procedures and services covered under the Physician Fee Schedule.

Ten Steps to Coding Anesthesia Services

Because relative value units measure the overall consumption of resources to deliver a medical service, they provide the foundation for cost analysis. To determine the cost per RVU for your practice, the formula is: ... The uniform relative value guide used by CMS breaks down anesthesia services into base units, which are assigned to anesthesia ...

What Are RVUs? - AAPC

The formula to calculate the allowed amount for anesthesia is: Base Units + Time (in units) x CF = Anesthesia Fee amount. For a list of base units assigned to anesthesia CPT codes for 2018, please refer to the 2018 Anesthesia Base Units by CPT Code on the CMS website.

Projections of decreased reimbursement from implementing a common RBRVS and the exclusion of the customary time component of the anesthesia service led anesthesiologists to successfully lobby in 1989 for the preservation of reimbursement by the methodology of the ASA RVG.4-6 The ASA RVU measures work input according to the sum of base, time, and modifier units. The base units reflect the complexity of each preoperative evaluation and the difficulty in planning and executing the anesthetic.

Whenever access to the airway is limited (e.g., field avoidance), the anesthesia work required may be substantially greater compared to the typical patient. This anesthesia care has a minimum base unit value of 5 regardless of any lesser base unit valued assigned to such procedure in the body of the Relative Value Guide.

Type of Anesthesia Regional Anesthesia Regional anesthesia involves the injection of local anesthetic drugs in such a way that a large number of nerves are blocked. This results in a large region of the body without sensation. It is similar to local anesthesia but has a larger effect. (example: Epidurals for delivery)

The Basics of Anesthesia Billing.

Anesthesia practices should provide the physician work component of the RVU for flat fee procedures only such as lines, blocks, critical care visits, intubations, and post-operative management care; and All RVUs associated with professional charges, including both medically necessary and

cosmetic RVUs.

And that is the breakdown between the work RVU, the practice expense RVU, and the malpractice RVU. And so if we follow the math, that means 2.58 RV use times \$37 equals 95.46. So what that means is that Medicare is willing to pay \$95 and 46 cents for a patient to receive this type of care.
